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THE URBAN YOUTH WORKERS IN AMERICA STUDY (UYWA STUDY)

We sifted through a 212,000 teenager data set to arrive at 7,171 youth who lived in cities, and whose mother did not graduate from high school.


FINDING #1: BARELY MORE
Non-urban kids have assets (19.6 versus 17.2) but the difference is not as as we expected.
FINDING #2: ASSET PEAKS When we analyzed 14 asset factors, there were asset factors in which urban kids score more nighly than non-urban kids: social conscience, personal values, and connection to family.
FINDING #3: THE GENDER GAP
Consistently in our UYWA study, as well as in Search's other research, exceed in the number of assets.
FINDING #4: BETTER YOUNGER
n our study, and in other Search research, kids consistenly nave fewer assets.
